Reflections on Today's Gospel

1. Re-read Mark 7: 31-37.
2. This man is doubly afflicted—as a foreigner he suffers isolation, and he is also excluded by his physical impairment. Jesus' action initiates a new age. He comes close enough to touch us, one by one. Do I intentionally or unintentionally exclude anyone from my life because of some "impairment" of theirs, physical or otherwise?
3. Lord, I hear your words to me, "Be open!" Unblock my ears, that I may listen to your Word. Open the door of my heart, that I may grow in sensitivity to the suffering of others. Liberate my tongue, that I may speak in gratitude of your loving kindness. Do I hear but not really listen to what the Lord is saying to me? Is my life so busy that I don't have the time to hear, listen and act on what I have heard from the Lord?

Ideas for a Sample Letter

I am appalled by the revelations surrounding Cardinal McCarrick and the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report on Sexual Abuse by clergy. I am even more shocked to discover the number of Bishops and Cardinals implicated in lying and trying to cover up the abuse. This news has profoundly saddened me and I know has shaken the faith of many Catholics.

I strongly encourage that a team should be formed of mostly lay Catholics, who are skilled in forensic investigation, to determine who among the hierarchy knew about this abuse and when did they know it. The church must do a thorough and transparent investigation to get at the Truth of the matter.

Priests proven guilty of abusing a minor should no long be allowed to function in ministry and be tried in civil court.

Bishops and Cardinals proven to have covered up the abuse and enable the abuse to continue should be made to resign and tried in criminal court as accomplices.

Priests, Bishops, Professors, Theologians, Religion Teachers who do not accept Church's teaching on sexuality and instead promote a homosexual agenda should not be allowed to continue to have a place of influence within the Catholic Church.
